Rights and Services for All Crime Victims

1. You have the right to apply for financial help for losses resulting from a violent crime. This assistance does <u>not</u> cover property losses. For application and information call Toll Free 1-888-622-8799 or TTD: 1-651-205-4827.

2. You have the right to request that the law enforcement agency withhold public access to data revealing your identity, if possible.

3. You have the right, if an offender is charged, to be informed of and participate in the prosecution process, including the right to request restitution (money court ordered from the offender paid to the victim).

4. In cases of homicide, the perpetrator cannot be a beneficiary of the deceased. Upon request, the court may issue an order protecting property of the deceased.

Victims of Domestic Assault

- 1. You can ask the city or county attorney to file a criminal complaint.
- You also have the right to go to court and file a petition requesting an Order for Protection from domestic assault. The order could include the tollowing:
 - a. an order restraining the abuser from further acts of abuse;
 - b. an order directing the abuser to leave your household;
 - c. an order preventing the abuser from entering your home, school, business, or place of employment;
 - d. an order awarding you or the other parent custody of or visitation with your minor child or children;
 - e. an order directing the abuser to pay support to you and the minor children if the abuser has a court order to do so.
- 3. You also have the right to notification if prosecution of the case is declined or criminal charges are dismissed.
